Driving Policy

- Purpose: To clearly define the requirements and expectations for operating the First Responder Vehicle(s).
- Scope: This policy applies to all individuals who join the Barriere First Responders Society.
- Policy:
- 1.1 A favorable drivers abstract that has less than 6 point over three years or 9 points over five years. Driver must not have any suspensions or any other impaired driving convictions or any Superintendent of Motor Vehicles caused suspensions.
 - 1.2 Every driver must be certified in Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVO) or equivalent and provide a drivers abstract annually.
 - 1.3 Members in training must drive three times routine with a senior member and be signed off on each response. Once completed, a member in training must drive three times code three with a senior member and be signed off on each response. Signing off will be done at the discretion of the senior member. Once a member has been signed off on three routine drives they will be allowed to drive the vehicle on routine responses.
 - 1.4 In the event the driver fails five attempts, the driver will be suspended from any driving until the Board of Directors does a review. Direction will be provided after review.

- 1.5 In the event of ANY motor vehicle incidents, it is the driver's responsibility to contact RCMP immediately for an investigation. Then contact the President of Barriere First Responders. If the President is not available, contact the Vice President.
Then report the incident to ICBC.

- 1.6 Any BAFRS member driving under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs will be subject to investigation by the RCMP. This will pertain to any motor vehicle; personal or any BAFRS owned vehicle.
Refer to Alcohol and Drugs Policy.
